Ubud - Gunung Kawi - Tirta Empul - Kintamani - Goa Gajah (B,L)

After breakfast, our guide will take you and proceed for a day tour visiting Gunung Kawi temple, Tirta Empul holy spring temple. Then continue drive to Kintamani to enjoy beautiful views on Mount Batur volcano & lake Batur. On the way back to the hotel, visit the remarkable 9th century Goa Gajah or Elephant Cave in Bedulu. It is one of Bali's most significant ancient sites.

Gunung Kawi

Gunung Kawi is an ancient temple complex located in the lush river valley near the town of Tampaksiring, which is situated just northeast of Ubud. It is one of Bali's largest ancient temple complexes and well-known for its historical and cultural significance. The complex features stone shrines and monuments carved directly into the cliffs of the river valley, creating a dramatic and impressive sight. The temple complex features impressive rock-cut shrines, which are dedicated to Balinese royalty from the 11th century. These large and ornate stone carvings are considered a masterpiece of ancient Balinese architecture and art. Gunung Kawi is a place of worship and commemoration for kings and queens of the past. By exploring the site, visitors can immerse themselves in the rich history and spirituality of Bali.



Tirta Empul

Balinese people will make regular pilgrimages to Tirta Empul. They come to cleanse themselves spiritually and heal their physical ailments by bathing in the holy spring water, considered the holiest in Bali since the tenth century. The shallow red-brick bathing pool sinks into the ground of the temple's outer courtyard, fed by water from a spring in the inner sanctuary. Men, women, and priests each have a separate section to immerse themselves in, though most modern devotees simply splash their faces and smile at the camera.



Penelokan, Kintamani

Penelokan, which means "place to look," is situated on the rim of the Mt Batur crater, offering stunning vistas of the Batur volcano and lake. Despite its small size, the volcano is located within a vast 14km-wide crater, surrounded by high walls. The immensity of the crater evokes memories of the colossal eruption of the original Mount Batur tens of thousands of years ago, which caused significant devastation. Today, the volcano remains active, as evidenced by the recollection of Balinese people who experienced the catastrophic eruption of 1917 that claimed thousands of lives and destroyed numerous temples, known as "the year when the world shook."



Goa Gajah

Goa Gajah is located near Ubud and dates back to the 9th century. A giant carving looking like an elephant's head, arches the entrance to Goa Gajah. The caves behind it once served for medieval meditation. The primary figure was initially thought to be an elephant, hence the nickname Elephant Cave. The site is mentioned in the Javanese poem of the early 14th century. An extensive bathing place on the site was not excavated until the 1950s. It appears to have been built to ward off evil spirits, and is used up to the present day for ritual cleansing.

Wednesday, August 07, 2024

Once in a while, you will have a close encounter with a lonely farmer or see how beautiful and meticulously offerings were placed on small shrines, honoring the omnipresent Goddess of the Rice and the Spirits of the Water. The descent on the river is a pleasant and different way to look at typical Balinese landscapes. It is at times exhilarating fun too.

Thursday, August 08, 2024

Ubud - Sangeh - Batukaru - Jatiluwih / Tabanan (B,L)

This morning, we leave to Jatiluwih / Tabanan.

First we will visit Sangeh monkey forest where a hordes of monkeys will welcome you. Then drive through the countryside passing villages and farmland all the way up to the base of Mount Batukaru and visit this to mountain temple.

After lunch, we have an easy walk / hike in Jatiluwih, a UNESCO heritage site with famous rice terraces. Check-in to your hotel and at leisure.

Sangeh Monkey Forest

Sangeh Monkey Forest near the village of Sangeh, in southwestern Bali, has six hectares of forestland with giant nutmeg trees. The main attractions here are the hordes of funny yet wise Balinese monkeys inhabiting both the trees and the temple, Pura Bukit Sari, found in the heart of the forest. The monkeys of the forest are believed to be sacred and indeed will approach anyone paying respects at the temple. Monkeys have a special status in Hindu religion, and a number of other temples in Bali also boast a resident monkey population, respected by devotees and fed and photographed by tourists.





Batukaru Temple

Pura Batukaru is one of the largest and oldest Hindu Temples in Bali. Built high up against a slope of Mount Batukaru, enshrined by lush tropical rain forest, a solemn atmosphere reigns. It is so quiet that you can hear the Gods whisper. Often one can mingle with Balinese, praying and offering amidst a series of shrines and merus. From a raised platform, a priest quietly looks on.



Jatiluwih

A startlingly beautiful area of verdant, terraced rice paddies nestled in the shadow of Mount Batukaru, the second highest peak of Bali and one of the holiest. Nestled in the highlands of Tabanan regency, Jatiluwih is a place of extraordinary beauty and cultural significance, a breathtaking landscape boasting rice terraces, spanning more than 53,000 hectares of fertile land, glistening under the warm Balinese sun. These terraces are not only a sight to behold but also hold a deep-rooted relevance in Balinese culture. Generations of local farmers toiled tirelessly, following the sacred irrigation system called Subak. It was developed based on the principles of harmony between man, nature, and the Creator. This intricate system has been practiced since the 11th century and deemed so important for Balinese culture, it was recognized by UNESCO as a cultural world heritage site in 2012. Jatiluwih is not merely a picturesque destination for tourists, but a place where Balinese culture thrives. The rice terraces are a testament to the island's rich agricultural heritage, as they were meticulously crafted on the hilly contours of the land, transforming steep landscapes into fertile fields of abundance. These terraces are the result of the locals' deep connection with nature, their commitment to sustainable farming practices, and their unwavering belief in maintaining balance between God, man, and the environment.

Friday, August 09, 2024

Tabanan - Ulun Danu Bratan - Tamblingan hike - Banyumala waterfall - Lovina (B,L)

After breakfast, depart to Lovina / North Bali.

First we will stop at Ulun Danu temple at Lake Bratan. Then continue for a hike through the tropical rain forest and end the trip crossing Tamblingan lake by using a traditional wooden canoe. After lunch, visit Banyumala waterfall before check-in to hotel in Lovina beach.

Ulun Danu Bratan Temple

Ulun Danu sits at the shores of Lake Bratan, the source of water for a large part of the island. It effortlessly combines Hindu and Buddhist elements into a unique sample of Balinese temple architecture. The location on the shore of the

giant lake effectively filling a crater formed thousands of years ago by a seismic blast of an extinct volcano, is significant. The lake supplies most of the drinkable water to large areas of Bali. Dense pine forests tumble down the slopes of Mount Bratan to the calm shoreline dotted with holy shrines.



Lake Tamblingan Trekking

Discover the serene beauty of Lake Tamblingan, nestled in the highlands at an elevation of 1,200 meters and surrounded by the towering Mount Catur. Immerse yourself in the rich culture and history of Bali as you visit the stunning Pura Ulun Danu, a temple dedicated to the Goddess of the lake and revered as a source of water for the island. Marvel at the unique blend of Hindu and Buddhist architectural styles and capture the perfect shot at one of the most photographed temples in Bali. Take a journey through the picturesque highlands and strawberry farms, and be awed by the stunning views of the twin lakes of Buyan and Tamblingan. Descend into the lush rainforest and learn about the medicinal properties of the local plants. Discover the eerie Pura Dalem Tamblingan, dedicated to the ancestors, and visit the sacred Pura Ulun Danu Tamblingan, dedicated to the Goddess of Lake Tamblingan. Admire the inspiring views of the lake and rainforest from this secluded temple and take a peaceful boat ride across the lake on a traditional wooden canoe. Explore the rarely visited holy site of Pura Gubug, a masterfully designed Hindu temple surrounded by the forested slopes. Be amazed by the unique pagoda roofs that rise from behind the temple's twin entrance gate. Soak up the tranquil atmosphere and listen to the birds singing as you wander through this holy place, a true gem hidden from the rest of the world.



Banyumala Twin Waterfall

Banyumala Waterfall is a stunning natural attraction located in the mountainous region of Northern Bali. This waterfall is often referred to as 'Banyumala Twin Waterfall' due to its unique feature of two parallel streams of water cascading down from the lush greenery. The lush tropical surroundings, crystal-clear water, and serene ambiance make it a paradise for nature enthusiasts and photographers alike. The pool at the base of the waterfall is a great spot for swimming and cooling off. The water is refreshing and clean, surrounded by the sounds of nature. Banyumala waterfall is a true hidden gem in Bali, offering a tranquil escape from the hustle and bustle of the modern life!

Banjar Buddhist Temple

Yet, the resilience of the resident monks shines through as they rebuilt the monastery to its former glory. Take a step inside and be transported to a place of worship and reverence, where visitors are encouraged to keep their voices low and respect the sanctity of the environment. Gaze in awe at the magnificent views of the surrounding hills and bask in the peacefulness of Lovina. Explore the intricate praying rooms and admire the golden Buddha's, and climb to the highest point of the complex where you will find a magnificent stupa, reminiscent of the famous Borobudur in Java. This is an experience unlike any other and one not to be missed!



Banjar Hot Spring

Menjangan Island: Snorkeling

As the road winds up higher, your eyes will meet stunning views of rice terraces, carved out delicately in the slopes of misty mountains. In many places you will see coffee, cloves and vanilla drying at the side of the road.



Tanah Lot Temple

This famous sea-side temple of Tanah Lot has been defying the Indian Ocean for centuries. The landmark temple was built to commemorate the spread of Hinduism from Java to Bali many centuries ago. Sitting on an eroded rocky outcrop between the sea and the beach, it is quite a sight. The temple, consisting of several shrines protected by poisonous black snakes, is fairly modest but as the tide rushes in and the islet becomes completely surrounded by water, the place becomes a mysterious spot.
